Supporting Our Students and Staff

How to Respond to Children's Questions

Children may have many questions and concerns following such an incident. Here are some guidelines for responding:

- **Be Honest and Age-Appropriate:** Provide truthful information suitable for your child's age, without unnecessary detail or speculation on what occurred.
- **Listen and Reassure:** Encourage children to express their feelings. Let them know it's normal to feel upset and reassure them that adults are working to keep them safe.
- **Maintain Routine:** Keeping regular schedules helps children feel secure amidst uncertainty.
- **Monitor Media Exposure:** Limit exposure to news coverage and social media, which can increase anxiety. Focus on compassion for those who are directly impacted.
- **Seek Support:** If your child seems overwhelmed or anxious, reach out to school administrators, counsellors or mental health professionals.
