2021 HONOURING DIVERSITY SPEAKER SERIES

One of the lasting structures emerging from the COVID context is how quickly our students, staff and community members have adapted to using technologies like Zoom and Microsoft Teams to connect. With accessible connectivity throughout most of the school district, teachers have been able to connect with families and student for most of the last year.

With that in mind, we wanted to create a speaker series that focused on our strategic goal of 'Honouring Diversity' by inviting a variety of respected speakers to present to our communities. We put together a panel of students and parents to ask questions and provide comments to engage our speakers while representing their various viewpoints and communities.






SPRING LEARNING ASSESSMENTS

Each year, our district wants to ensure that all children make a year's gain in their learning.

To help check on gains and plan for interventions where students may be struggling in the key areas of literacy and numeracy, we count on a variety of tools to help assess student learning. We use report



card data, reading assessments like PM Benchmarks,

RAD, FSA and the provincial literacy assessments, and numeracy tools like SNAP, our District Numeracy Assessment (DNA), FSA, and provincial numeracy assessments.

We encourage are parents to discuss their child's learning and how they are doing on various assessments with their child's teacher and the school principal. Using reliable data helps us to ensure that our children are making the growth we expect and providing interventions as needed.

Although we are committed to the goal of ensuring student success, we count on parents as our partners in this journey. Sso please take some time next time you are at your child's school to find out more about the literacy and numeracy assessments we

are using.
